Blackberry Busters Needed!



Langley has several watershed stewardship groups that work passionately to rid natural spaces of invasive weed species. Beginning this past month, the [Glen Valley Watersheds Society](#) began their goal of tackling the population of blackberry plants in the West Creek Wetlands.

These fabulous folks will be tackling the brambles: **April 5 & 19**

This is a great opportunity to visit this sensitive wildlife area that is not yet publicly accessible, while working with folks who are passionate about the environment.

Work gloves, tools and refreshments will be provided. Rain or shine so come prepared for the weather, sturdy shoes are required.

Meet at the gate on the south side of 72 Ave about 400m west of 264 St. Please park on the north side of 72 Ave.

Planting Volunteers Needed

LEPS is assisting the Township of Langley with a steep slope restoration project as part of the East Langley Water Supply project. LEPS will be planting native plants at the 234 Street slope at the end of 52Ave (east of 232 Street) on **Friday April 15** and **Saturday April 16**, starting at **9:30am**.



Volunteers will need sturdy, water resistant footwear as this site is a very steep hillside, as well as clothes that can get dirty and wet, as the lower portion of the planting site is quite wet and will likely be very muddy to plant in. If its sunny, please wear a hat and sunscreen, as the slope is open and exposed. LEPS can provide tools and work gloves, but if you can, please bring your own gloves and spade for planting.

Lichen Monitoring

What are lichen and why are we so excited about them?

Lichens can be found all around us, growing slowly in colours of grey, green, black, bright orange or yellow and even pink. They live on trees, on decaying wood, and on stone. Lichens are an important part of ecosystem health and are considered as significant bio-indicators of air quality.



Our Lichen Monitoring Booklet and Data Collection Sheets will soon be available on our website. Check them out and join in your own local lichen hunt. You too can take a likin' to lichen!

One of our current staff, Meg Jordan, has been doing Lichen presentations to senior groups, as well as with elementary school and university students; sharing all about the wonders of our local lichens.
